Celebration Ideas

- Host a badge making day where staff and/or Community can make their own flag or pronoun badges
- Invite staff to wear purple in the office and in virtual backgrounds (for Wear it Purple Day)
- Host a trivia event for staff and/or Community with questions that amplify Rainbow Mob achievements
- Host an internal or external guest speaker from an Aboriginal or LGBTQIASB+ organisation/program for a 'lunch and learn' or morning tea
- Organise a Cultural Safety and/or other intersectional training workshop
- Invite staff to wear one colour of their choice, to bring everyone together to stand in a rainbow
- Host a watch or listen event of an existing Rainbow Mob video or podcast
- Share Rainbow Mob date celebration and resources through internal and external communication channels
- Cut up fruit and veggie platters in rainbow colours for morning tea or lunch events
- Host a banner making, mural making or other art making event for staff and/or Community to be displayed throughout the year
- Host an event to create Rainbow Mob Affirmation Cards

Safer Celebrations

- Ensure staff engaging with the events have Rainbow Mob/ Aboriginal Cultural Safety/ LGBTQIASB+ Inclusive Practice training
- Communicate with participants before the events about the event, and provide resources for individual learning (vaccho.org.au/rainbowmob)
- At the start and during the events, prioritise safety for Rainbow Mob and reminding that this is not a place for debate or comments/questions that might make people feel unsafe
- Support Rainbow Mob to be included in the planning of celebrations and events without adding the burden of labour
- Support Rainbow Mob and an inclusive focus to be included throughout the year and the organisation/programs work
